# ABOUT POSITIVE BEHAVIOR SUPPORT

Positive Behavior Support (PBS) is a program designed to teach respect, responsibility and safety at school. At Roosevelt Elementary we hope to encourage students to continuously make good behavioral choices by implementing this program.

PBS provides teachers and other school staff with information to help prevent behavior problems and help make school a safe learning environment.

PBS is a research-based program which can result in:

- Increased time for instruction
- An increase in positive behaviors school-wide
- A decrease in disruptive behaviors

### **How the Program Works**

- In this brochure you will find the Roosevelt Elementary Expectations for behavior. These expectations will be posted in each classroom and throughout the school.
- Posters made by the students that highlight behavior expectations for all areas of the school—from the classrooms, playground and bus room to the restrooms and buses—will remind students of what is expected from them in each area.
- Reminders about behavior and expectations will be delivered daily to the students by other students through our "Words of Wisdom" program.
- Each classroom will track the students' daily behavior through their classroom Behavior Management Chart.
- Students will track their behavior on their personal behavior calendar which will be kept in their folder.

Green = Good behavior Yellow = Warning Red = Detention Blue = Removal from class  Please review the calendar each night with your child and discuss their behavior at school that day. Please leave the calendar in the folder.

#### **PBS Extras**

- Roosevelt Bucks. Good behavior will be rewarded with "Roosevelt Bucks "that can be spent at the School Store.
- Monthly Activities. Students with consistent good behavior will be able to participate in a monthly activity as a reward for their good behavior. Activities may include dances, extra recess, crafts, etc.
- Wall of Fame. Look for our Wall of Fame Bulletin Board where students with consistent good behavior will be acknowledged.
- Intervention Groups. Student calendars will be reviewed each month. Those students who have excessive yellow and red days will participate in intervention groups conducted by the counselor to provide instruction in appropriate school behavior.
- **Behavior Plans.** These are plans that are put in place for students needing specific help and reminders about behavior.
