- all students K-12 shall have access to a fulltime, state-certified master's degree-level school counselor

- utilize the many combined resources of the community
- be evaluated on specified goals and agreedupon competencies

And that all School counselors will:

- abide by the professional ethics of guidance and counseling advocated by the American School Counselor Association (ASCA)
- abide by professional mandates and guidelines proposed by ASCA shall continue to set standards for the school counseling program

- be committed to an ongoing program of counselor competency training/retraining to maintain a quality school counseling program

## **Benefits**

Successful school counseling programs have a positive impact on students, parents or guardians, teachers, administrators, boards of education, school counselors, counselor educators, post-secondary institutions and our communities.

## **Components**

The four areas included in the school counseling program are:

1. Guidance Curriculum – classroom and group activities
2. Individual Student Planning – activities to assist the individual student in establishing personal goals and developing future plans
3. Responsive Services – activities to meet students' immediate needs
4. System Support – professional development, consultation, collaboration and teaming, program management and operation
